



Series Summary: Everyone loves a story that includes a hero who saves the day. Entire movie franchises are built from the spinoff of one hero. There are some amazing accounts of heroes in the Bible. But their stories are very different than our typical fictional heroes. Let's learn what it takes to be a Faith Hero by looking at the Hall of Faith.

Sermon summary: Abraham is the father of many people and nations. He exhibited great faith by leaving everything to follow God to an unknown place. But he also had moments of very weak faith. We can learn a great deal by observing his growing faith and relationship with God.

Big Idea: Great Faith Produces Obedience

Icebreaker: Have you ever taken a trip without knowing the destination? What was that experience like?

Discussion:

1. During the message we looked at Abraham and Sarah's lack of faith regarding a promised son. What other things did Abraham do that showed a lack of faith?
2. In hindsight, have there been times when you had a lack of faith? How did that turn out?
3. What are some of the things that Abraham did which showed great faith?
4. How did God use different events and circumstances to grow Abraham's faith?
5. What experiences has God used to grow your faith in Him?
6. What made the relationship between God and Abraham so special that he was called "a friend of God"?
7. What does it take for us to be "a friend of God"?

Know: Faith in God results in obedience to God.

Be: aware of God's development of your faith.

Do: Continue to grow your faith by learning through each part of your journey.
